#### TOWN OF WOODSTOCK PANDEMIC PREPAREDNESS PLANNING

FY 2020 Budget Reduction Response & FY 2021 Budget Preparation Topic:

Effective: March 30, 2020 through June 30, 2020

I. Directive

> The Town of Woodstock has the important responsibility to its citizenry to plan for the future and to manage public funds with both accuracy and integrity. Because the Town is constantly seeking to adapt in order to meet the needs of our community, long-range planning and sound policy-making is a significant priority. It is the intent of the Town of Woodstock to be both fiscally responsive and responsible during emergency/disaster situations. This guidance is provided to all departments regarding budget adjustments due to a potential drop in revenue as a result of quick, dramatic changes within the economy.

II. Procedure

A. One-time expenditure purchases less than \$1,000

- 1. All one-time expenditure purchases less than \$1,000 should be discussed with the department director/division head to determine if the purchase is essential. If the expenditure is deemed as essential then normal purchasing procedures should be followed. If the purchase is not essential, please delay the purchase.
- B. Expenditure purchases greater than \$1,000
- 1. A "Documentation of Quotes Solicited" form with all supporting documentation should be submitted to the Director of Finance (DOF) & Town Manager (TM) for review/approval. The "Justification" section of the form should include details explaining the priority level and justification of necessity.

Please note: All requests will be scrutinized for necessity and possibly funded if deemed essential. Non-essential requests should not be submitted at this time

- C. Capital Projects, as approved in the FY 2020 Budget
- 1. Capital projects approved within the FY 2020 Budget should follow the direction outlined below:

#### D. Budget development for Fiscal Year 2021

- ut ", amend, revoke, or 1. An evaluation of the fiscal impact of the COVID-19 pandemic is currently being conducted by the Town's executive and finance departments. This will be discussed further in upcoming budget sessions with the Finance Committee and Town Council to determine what considerations will be given to potential reductions and/or level spending for the upcoming fiscal year. This may include deferment or elimination of expenditures/projects, as deemed necessary/appropriate.
- 2. Meetings will be held with each department following approval of the FY 2021 budget to discuss the approved budget and to answer any questions each department may have.
- III. General Provisions





# MOVING FORWARD: FY 2022 BUDGET SEASON



- Staff team support
  - Employee recognition and rest as essential to prevent burnout
  - Virtual learning stipend for employees who had to shift quickly to find childcare/educational institutions for their dependents
  - Additional 599 funds for LEOs deposited for towns and cities
- Revenue projections are looking better than originally anticipated, but still below FY 2020 (and previous budget years)
  - Real/Personal Property collected more of the balance YTD than this time last year (not delaying collection has benefited the Town)
  - Other Local Taxes above projection, below pre-COVID levels
  - Water & Sewer Consumption below pre-COVID levels and 3 year avg.
  - System Development Charges well above projection due to continued real estate development
- Looking forward to a FY 2021 budget amendment (Due to some CARES Act Funding)
- Releasing marketing <u>videos</u> now through spring



# MOVING FORWARD Lessons Learned



- Elected officials' strategic, yet difficult decisions assisted in maintaining appropriate revenues to remain fiscally sound
- Investment of financial and human resources into economic development is essential
  - Small business support
  - Continued/enhanced marketing
  - Continued financial incentives by the EDA Tourism Zone + Façade RENEW
  - Continued public realm improvements to bring about pride in community
- Understanding your locality's financial structural deficiencies and communicating to elected officials
- Supporting those who are doing the work for your locality is essential
